

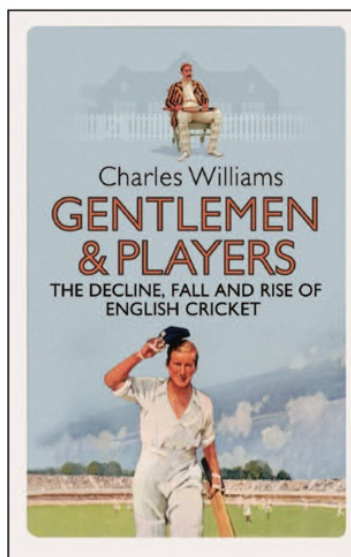
James Wong Incredible Edibles

Charles Williams Gentlemen and Players

Amateurs versus professionals – a social history of English cricket from 1953 to 1963.

Gentlemen v Players was a first-class match between teams consisting of amateurs (the Gentlemen) and professionals (the Players). This book focuses on the final ten years of amateurism and the *Gentlemen v Players* fixture, concluding with the abolition of amateurism in 1962. This vivid social history-cum-memoir looks at the attempt in post-war Britain to recreate a Golden Age, one whose expiry exactly coincided with a cricket revolution.

Charles Williams (Lord Williams of Elvel) is a former Deputy Leader of the opposition in the House of Lords and the author of five acclaimed biographies.
