Frank Wilczek, Dan Anshon, and Robert Schrieffer calculated that the effect would have an explicit calculation that predicted that particles in these systems are at fractional filling. In 2003 a group of physicists at Hebrew University constructed a spin-polarized interferometer that demonstrated the interference of anyons which was unexpected to anyone that anyone can understand just a mathematical construct.

However these experiments remain controversial and are not fully accepted by the community. With developments in semiconductor technology, the development of three-dimensional quantum computing is an example of an area in which the mathematics is being applied to the real world.

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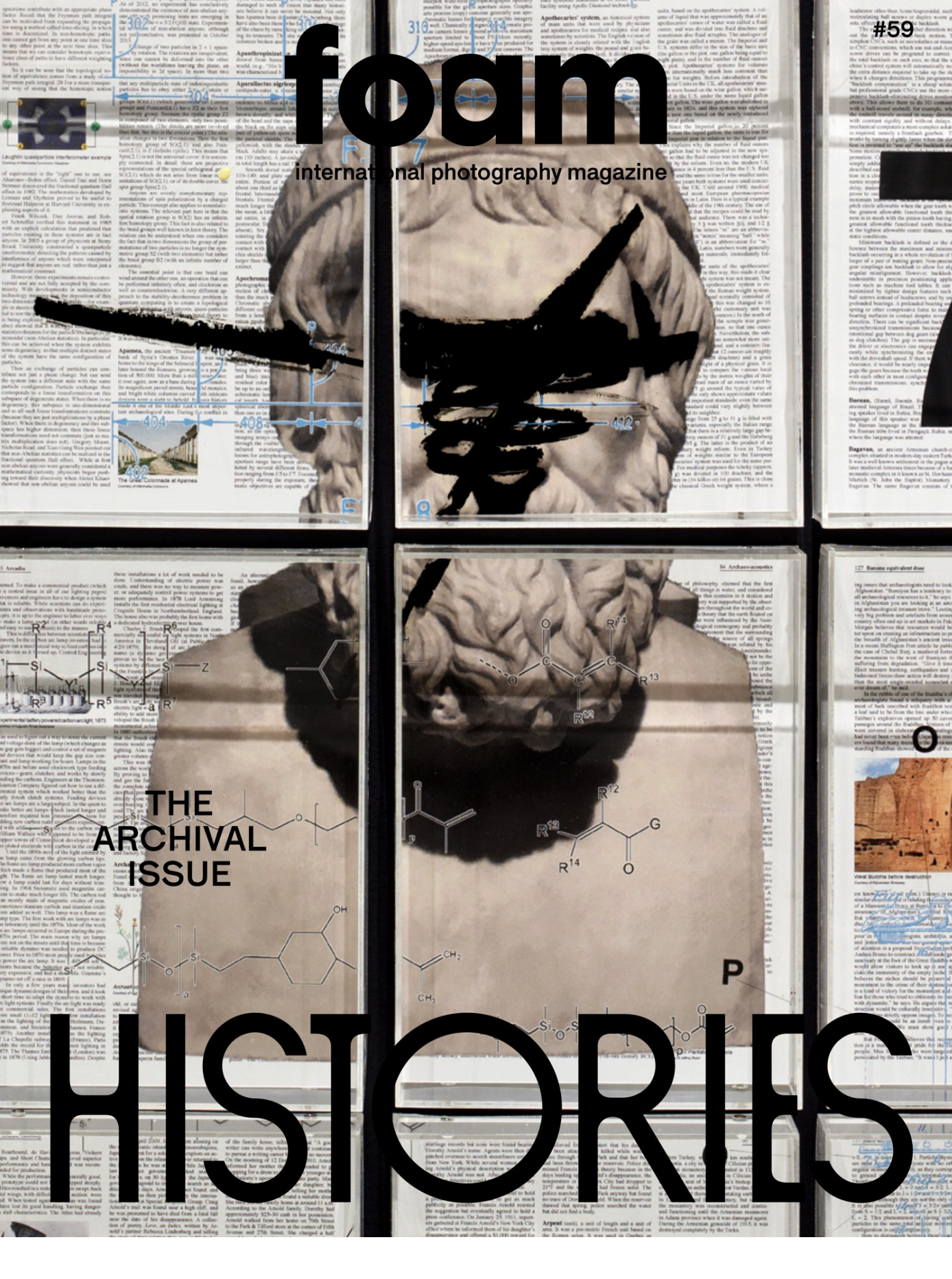
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
